The event was one of the largest Championship events the club has ever hosted with beautiful, spring-like conditions under clear blue skies and the iconic Okanagan sun.

Athletes from as young as 7 to 77 raced for three days in three events including a Mass Start (Free Technique), Interval Start (Classic Technique) and Relay (Free Technique). Results of the Teck BC Cup Series individual aggregate awards were announced at the banquet on Saturday evening and the BC Championship Club Trophy was announced at the final awards ceremony

on Sunday. Telemark placed a close third behind the Black Jack Ski Club of Rossland, which came second, and the Hollyburn Cross Country Ski Club of North Vancouver, which won the overall team aggregate award for a second year in a row.
