Camp opened Friday night with some striding instruction and agility/strength work in the CNSC Agility Park. The older athletes then went on a long run to the upper reaches of the Caledonia facility. Athletes enjoyed a delicious dinner courtesy of the CNSC food team. The day wrapped up with a few rounds of the ever-popular Man Tracker as the sun set.

Saturday started foggy as camping athletes did their morning activation. The fog lifted by the time everyone arrived at Willow Cale Road for a morning of skate roller skiing agility and technique. The agility courses were very popular with all ages! After a break for lunch, the older athletes headed to the disc golf course at the Hart Ski Hill. Younger athletes enjoyed a Scavenger Run, stopping at 6 stations for a strength activity and a Canadian ski trivia question, with striding intervals in between. Wrapping up the evening with another delicious dinner, more Man Tracker, and a question-and-answer session around the fire with athletes and coaches. The younger athletes had many great questions about racing, nutrition, and body positivity.



Sunday morning saw blue skies once again, making another great day for roller skiing at Willow Cale. The older athletes worked on agility and technique on classic skis, while younger athletes worked on double poling and more agility. Camp wrapped up at noon with all the ski north athletes heading to their perspective areas of the North.
