Black Jack Ski Club Delivers Successful 2025 Teck BC Track Attack Championships

January 28, 2025, Rossland, BC: The Black Jack Ski Club successfully hosted the 2025 Teck BC Track Attack Championships on January 25th and 26th. Fifteen clubs - 13 from across BC and two from Washington State, and 183 racers born in the years 2012 - 2015 (ages 9 to 12) competed in three competitions over two days. It was the first time in the 25-year history of the event that the Black Jack Ski Club has hosted the Teck BC Track Attack Championships.

The three competitions included an Interval Start race, an Individual Sprint race (using a King’s Court format which ensured that all participants race all four rounds), and a Team Relay. The relay was a highlight for all racers. It included costumes, face paint and fun team names.
