





Teck BC Cup 2 Draws a Crowd at Whistler Olympic Park

Whistler, BC – The Black Tusk Nordic Events Society (BTNES) hosted the **Teck BC Cup 2** at Whistler Olympic Park, Callaghan Valley, this past weekend. 352 racers participated in the interval start classic technique on Saturday, under sunny skies and dry conditions, while 372 racers tackled the mass start free technique race under challenging but much-awaited snowy conditions on Sunday.



Participants represented 20 cross country ski clubs from across BC, including Black Jack Ski Club (Rossland), Bulkley Valley Cross Country Ski Club (Smithers), Caledonia Nordic Ski Club (Prince George), Fernie Nordic Society, Hollyburn Cross Country Ski Club (North Vancouver), Kimberley Nordic Club, Larch Hills Nordic Society (Salmon Arm), Nelson Nordic Ski Club, Nickel Plate Cross Country Ski Club (Penticton), Nordic Racers Ski Club (Vancouver), Overlander Ski Club (Kamloops), Revelstoke Nordic Ski Club, Sea to Sky Nordic Ski Club, Sovereign Lake Nordic Club (Vernon), Spud Valley Nordic Ski Club (Pemberton), Strathcona Nordic Ski Club (Courtenay), Telemark Nordic Club (Kelowna), Whistler Nordic Ski Club, Williams Lake Cross Country Ski Club, as well as representatives from the

Nakkertok Nordic Ski Club (Gatineau, QC) and Highland Trailblazers (Duntroon, ON).

An event that attracts nearly 400 athletes would not be possible without the support and dedication of many volunteers. More than 60 people helped with grooming, waxing, timing, marshalling, coaching, parking, announcing, and overall logistics to ensure an enjoyable event for all.
